Welcome (Barbie Dwyer)—Barbie welcomed everyone and called the meeting to order at 9:35 am.

Principal's Report (Rick Swanson)

- March was an incredibly busy month for academics, athletics and the arts. Highlights include:
 - End of term 3/beginning of Term 4
 - First round of MCAS testing (ELA for sophomores)
 - Drama Club outstanding performance of “The Dark Road” at the Mass Theater Guild drama competition-although they didn’t move on in the competition, the HHS student body was very moved by the production and it opened up great dialogue in and out of the classroom on issues relating to intolerance
 - All Town Concerts and the Talent Expo showcased fantastic performances
 - The Advanced Art Show/All Town Art show were hits with the community
 - StuCo was awarded the Gold Award
 - Model UN attended a competition at BC
 - Veteran’s Appreciation Club presented \$750 donation to the Wild Hearts Horses for Heroes organization
 - GCP hosted students and teachers from South Africa for two days
 - Newly formed DECA club sent 4 students to state competition
 - Winter sports had an amazing season with all sports moving on to championships. Boys Basketball had their best season ever; Girls Basketball, Girls Hockey, Boys Hockey all made it to tournaments. Two track team high jumpers and one Swimmer qualified for Nationals are just some of the highlights from athletics.
 - A Rugby Club has been initiated at HHS by students
 - Unified Track & Field has been added to Spring sports. They will compete in 6 meets this season
 - The walkout on March 21 led by students and supported by administration was thoughtful, respectful, and well represented.

Treasurer's Report (Jane McGrath)

- A review of the 2017/2018 HHS PTO budget and discussion to set the HHS PTO budget for 2018/2018 was held. Discussion points:
 - Dues to be increased by \$5
 - Reserves will be removed from the income statement and moved to the balance sheet to better reflect income/expenses versus cash balances
 - Extreme Couponing donation of \$500 will be a separate line item; mini grants reduced by \$500 (extreme couponing is an annual donation)
 - Online directory versus hard copy directory under consideration

On a motion made by Michelle Ayer, seconded by Liz Donahue, the 2018/2019 budget was approved, as presented
